The California State Department of Education issued notification and guidelines to apply for continued funding under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, Public Law 113-128, for the 2016-17 school year. Anticipated funding is approximately \$1,053,437. The district has participated in this program since 1999.

The district anticipates serving approximately 3,500 students in the area of English instruction and basic education for the 2016-17 school year. The federal funds will be used to augment standards state apportionment in supporting the following areas:

1. Supplementary instruction materials for English as a Second Language, Vocational English as a Second Language (VESL), EL Civics, EL Citizenship Preparation, and Adult Basic Education.
2. Instructional material for adult literacy skills essential in achieving a high school diploma or GED.

Agenda Item 6 – A: Resolution No. 24 – Increase in Statutory School Fees

Effective February 24, 2016, the State Allocation Board (SAB) approved the increase of developer fee rates to \$3.48 per square foot of assessable space for new residential construction; \$0.56 per square foot of assessable space for new residential construction used exclusively for the housing of senior citizens; \$0.56 per square foot of chargeable covered and enclosed space for commercial/industrial construction; and \$0.10 per square foot for covered and enclosed space for rental self-storage properties. The SAB is allowed to increase fees biennially per Government Code Section 65995. Education Code Section 17620 allows the district to establish new maximum amounts by adopting a board resolution and holding a public hearing. A Notice of Public Hearing was posted 10 days prior to the meeting. The School Fee Justification Study has been available for public inspection and comment from March 1 through March 15, 2016. If approved, the revised fees will become effective May 14, 2016.

Procedural requirements for the raising of fees are outlined in the Garden Grove Unified School District School Fee Justification Study Report.

Agenda Item 6 – B: Renaming of the Stadium at Garden Grove High School to the Michael A. Monsoor Memorial Stadium

Pursuant to Board Policy 3133, Administrative Regulation 3133.1 (C) the Garden Grove Unified School District Board held a public hearing on March 1, 2016, to determine if it was in the best interest of the district to rename the stadium at the Garden Grove High School site, located at 11271 Stanford Avenue, Garden Grove, CA 92840, to the Michael A. Monsoor Memorial Stadium. Notice of the hearing was posted in three places in the district: the Education Center, 10331 Stanford Avenue, Garden Grove; La Quinta High School, 10372 McFadden Avenue, Westminster; and Pacifica High School, 6851 Lampson Avenue, Garden Grove.

Michael A. Monsoor attended Dr. Walter C. Ralston Intermediate School and Garden Grove High School, where he played tight end on the varsity football team and graduated in 1999. He enlisted in the Navy in 2001 and completed initial training as an elite SEAL in 2004. During combat against insurgents in Ramadi, Iraq, Monsoor sacrificed his life when he leaped on a live grenade to save two SEAL team comrades in September 2006.

Petty Officer Monsoor was posthumously awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor in 2008 by President George W. Bush. The Medal of Honor is the highest award for valor in action against an enemy force which can be bestowed upon an individual serving in the Armed Services of the United States.

The month following the awarding of the Medal of Honor to Monsoor, dedication ceremonies were held at Garden Grove High School for the Michael A. Monsoor Freedom Memorial, homage to the 24 GGHS graduates who gave their lives in the line of duty while serving in the U.S. armed forces. The memorial is displayed in the school's Heritage Hall and includes photographs of all 24 graduates, a collection of their personal memorabilia, and flags of all U.S. military service branches. Monsoor is honored with a special plaque in the center of the exhibit.
