Agenda Item 4 – B: California Department of Education Learning Communities for School Success Grant

California voters passed Proposition 47, the Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act (SNSA), in November 2014. Subsequent legislation in 2016, established the Learning Communities for School Success program. The SNSA reduced the penalties for certain non-violent, non-serious drug and property crimes. State savings resulting from these changes are to be spent on mental health and drug programs, kindergarten through twelfth-grade students, and crime victims.

The Garden Grove Unified School District requests permission to apply for the Learning Communities for School Success grant. If awarded this grant, the district will be able to enhance our current strategic plan goals, especially Goal 2B, Social and Emotional Well-Being. The grant supported initiatives will include establishing contracts for additional mental health professionals (such as social workers), providing training for district staff in the general areas of mental health and social emotional learning, and strengthening mental/health resources for students and families. If approved for the grant, the Garden Grove Unified School District will be awarded \$2 million over a three-year span (July 1, 2017, through June 30, 2020). The district will be required to obligate 20 percent in matching funds from the existing School Based Mental Health program. The federal Now is the Time grant, also awarded for mental health, will expire in two years. This new grant will complement and enhance those existing programs.

It is recommended that the Board grant permission to the district to apply for the Learning Communities for School Success grant in the amount of \$2 million over a three-year span (July 1, 2017, through June 30, 2020).

Based on a review of plans available, premium costs, and level of service, Myers-Stevens & Toohey & Company offers the best variety of coverage available. Myers-Stevens & Toohey & Company has provided accident insurance to district students since the 1980-81 school year. The company also offers tackle football, health and dental plans at reasonable costs. Their record of service has been excellent and their rates remain competitive with no increase since 2013.

Premiums are experience-rated reflecting levels of utilization and costs of plan administration. The 2017-18 plans are underwritten by BCS Insurance Company. Insurance plans are available to all students, preschool through twelfth grade.
