GARDEN GROVE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT SALARY AND RELATED INFORMATION FOR CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES

<u>SALARY MATRIX</u>: The salary schedules of the Classified Service are based upon a matrix of 2.5% between salary ranges and 5% between steps.

<u>SALARY STEP INCREASES</u>: Classified employees move across the salary steps on their anniversary dates. These step increases are granted annually until reaching Step 5.

INITIAL HIRE-IN STEP PLACEMENT: Normally, all classified employees will start employment in the district on Step 1. Initial step placement up to Step 5 may be approved by the Personnel Director upon review of prior experience and salary history. Some classifications have an automatic higher initial hire-in step placement. Please refer to the salary schedule for details.

STEP PLACEMENT AFTER PROMOTION OR DEMOTION: An employee who receives a promotion is moved to the new classification's higher salary range, and then to that step of the higher range that will provide, if possible, at least a 5% salary increase from the employee's previous base salary. An employee receiving a demotion shall be moved to the new classification's lower salary range, and then to that step of the lower range that will provide a base salary as close as possible to the previous higher salary, without providing a salary increase.

SHIFT DIFFERENTIALS: Employees whose regular assignments require them to work at least one-half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of their shift between the hours of 4:30 p.m. and midnight receive a "swing shift" differential of 2.5% of their base regular salary. Employees whose regular assignments require them to work at least one-half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of their regular shift between the hours of midnight and 7:00 a.m. receive a "graveyard shift" differential of 3% of their base regular salary.

SPECIAL RATES: A special differential rate of four (4) ranges (or 10%) above the base salary has been established for bargaining unit employees who perform work in the following areas: Asphalting, Cement Work (3 yards or more), Chipper, Roofing, and Sandblasting. This special rate is paid for every hour worked in the above areas. A special differential of two (2) ranges (or 5%) has also been established in the classification of Grounds Equipment Operator II for the one position required to obtain and maintain a California Pest Control Certificate. This special differential is paid to this position eight (8) hours per day, twelve (12) months per year.

<u>MILEAGE</u>: Employees who use their personal vehicles for district authorized activities receive reimbursement at the current IRS rate.

PROFESSIONAL GROWTH INCREMENTS: Classified employees (excluding management) are entitled to participate in a professional growth plan that provides four (4) additional salary increments of 35 cents per hour (up to \$1.40 per hour) for taking approved job-related classes, seminars, workshops, and degree programs.

LONGEVITY INCREMENT: Classified employees are eligible to receive the following longevity increments: an increase of 2.5% of regular salary range and step after nine (9) years of service; a total of 5% of regular salary range and step after fourteen (14) years of service; a total of 7.5% of regular salary range and step after nineteen (19) years of service; a total of 10% of regular salary range and step after twenty-four (24) years of service.

VACATION: All regular employees in the classified service receive vacation based on years of service. The vacation allowance for a twelve (12) month employee is twelve (12) days for service of less than four (4) years, fifteen (15) days for service of more than four (4) but less than eight (8) years, sixteen (16) days for service of more than nine (9) years, seventeen (17) days for service of more than nine (9) but less than ten (10) but less than eleven (11) years, nineteen (19) days for service of more than eleven (11) but less than twelve (12) years, twenty (20) days for service of more than twelve (12) but less than fourteen (14) years, and twenty-two (22) days for service over fourteen (14) years. Confidential and Supervisory employees with less than eight (8) years of service receive fifteen (15) days, those with more than eight (8) years receive twenty-two (22) days of vacation. Management employees receive twenty-two (22) days of vacation at initial employment. Employees working less than twelve (12) months have the vacation allowance pro-rated.
