Agreement Between the Community Action Partnership of San Luis Obispo County, Inc. Migrant and Seasonal Head Start Programs and the Garden Grove Unified School District

The purpose of this new agreement between the Community Action Partnership of San Luis Obispo, Inc. Migrant and Seasonal Head Start Program and the Garden Grove Unified School District is to provide guidelines and procedures for special education services for pre-school children of migrant workers who attend Garden Grove Unified schools. This agreement is in compliance with federal and state laws and regulations under the IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act) Law of 2004 and the Head Start Act of 2007. This agreement will ensure that infants and preschool children eligible for special education will have a smooth and timely transition from the San Luis Obispo County, Inc. Migrant and Seasonal Head Start Programs to the district should they move to the area. The effective date of the agreement is April 2016 through April 2020 and will be reviewed every three years.
