Agenda Item 6 – A: Resolution No. 12 – Amending Bylaws Governing the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee

Voters in the Garden Grove Unified School District passed Measure A in November 2010 (63.8 percent voter approval) and Measure P in November 2016 (76.3 percent voter approval). The ballot measures were conducted under Proposition 39, being chaptered as the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000, at Section 15264 et seq. of the Education Code of the State of California. Pursuant to Section 15278 of the Education Code, on October 5, 2010, the district established the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (Committee) for Measure A to satisfy the accountability requirements of Proposition 39. The Committee has duties and rights set forth in their bylaws, and oversees the expenditures made in connection with the ballot measures approved in the elections pursuant to Proposition 39. The Committee may review quarterly expenditure reports produced by the district to ensure that: a) bond proceeds are expended only for the purposes set forth in the applicable ballot measure; and b) no bond proceeds are used for any teacher or administrative salaries or other operating expenses. The Committee does not have independent legal capacity from the district.

Since Measure P passed, the Board of Education of the Garden Grove Unified School District hereby amends the bylaws governing the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee to include Measure P and any future bond measures (Sections 1, 2, and 3.2).

Current Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee bylaws also state that each member shall serve a term of two years, but no more than three consecutive terms (Section 5.4). Legal counsel has advised the district to add the term "or as many as permitted by law" in this bylaw section in the event that laws governing Committee terms change further in the future.

It is recommended that the Board adopt Resolution No. 12 amending Sections 1, 2, 3.2, and 5.4 of the Bylaws of the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee.
