Agenda Item 6 – A: Resolution No. 16 – Emergency Swimming Pool Repairs at Santiago High School

On or about November 5, 2017, it was discovered that there were several leaks in the plaster surface of the swimming pool at Santiago High School. The water leak posed an immediate risk to life, property, and ongoing operations at the school, requiring a complete resurfacing of the swimming pool at costs estimated on a time and materials basis not to exceed \$215,000, for which district staff retained Ultimate Pool Remodeling to perform the necessary repairs which were properly completed on December 1, 2017.

Pursuant to statutory authority in cases of emergency, including the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (Public Contract Code §§ 22035, 22050), the district is authorized to procure without bidding certain services and work that must be expeditiously performed to mitigate damage, secure public safety, and to ensure the district's ability to provide essential public services, including the continuance of existing school classes. At the earliest possible date that conditions warrant, the Board must terminate the emergency action so that any remaining work may be completed by giving notice for bids to let contracts. Accordingly, since the repair work and replacement of the pipes has been fully completed, the conditions warrant terminating the emergency action.

It is recommended that the Board adopt Resolution No. 16, finding that an emergency existed related to the Santiago High School swimming pool water leak, and authorizing any contracts entered into by the Superintendent or her designees to remediate and respond to that emergency, and terminating the emergency action as the conditions so warrant.

Agenda Item 6 – B: Authorization to Participate in the California Multiple Award Schedule – Purchase of Non-Information Technology Products and Services (Contract No. 4-07-51-0020A)

Effective October 12, 1994, the State of California approved the use of California Multiple Award Schedules (CMAS) by local governments (i.e. city, county, district, or other local governmental body empowered to expend public funds) for non-information technology products and services. Using a CMAS contract would be a cost-effective manner of procurement for non-information technology products and services.

Public Contract Code Section 20118 et al. provide that the governing board of any school district, without advertising for bids, may authorize any public agency to purchase equipment and services for its use in the manner in which the public agency is authorized by law to make such purchases. The State of California authorized school districts to purchase products and services from Turf Star, Inc. (CMAS Contract No. 4-07-51-0020A) on the California Multiple Award Schedules in accordance with the same specifications, terms, and conditions. The CMAS contract with Turf Star, Inc. for mowers and grounds equipment is valid from November 9, 2017, through November 30, 2022.

It is recommended that the Board authorize the use of the California Multiple Award Schedule with Turf Star, Inc. (CMAS Contract No. 4-07-51-0020A) to purchase non-information technology products and services.

Education Code (EC) section 17406 states that a school district, "without advertising for bids, may let ... real property that belongs to the district if the [lease] requires the lessee ... to construct ... a building or buildings for the use of the school district" ("Lease/Leaseback"). Governing board action is required for the district to award the six separate Lease/Leaseback contracts described herein (individually a "Lease/Leaseback Contract", and collectively, the "Lease/Leaseback Contracts"). Each respective Lease/Leaseback Contract consists of respective site lease and facilities lease documents and all attachments thereto (the "Lease/Leaseback Contract Documents").

The district invited all interested contractors to prequalify to perform the work of the contracts identified in the attached list and then requested proposals from all prequalified contractors. Proposals were received from general contractors and staff is recommending that the Board award contracts as shown in the attached list. The plans and specifications have been submitted to the Division of the State Architect and will be approved by December 31, 2017.

Agenda Item 6 – F: Agreement with ReliaStar Life Insurance Company dba Voya Financial and Stealth Partner Group

ReliaStar Life Insurance Company dba Voya Financial provides "Stop Loss" insurance to employers with self-funded medical plans. Stealth Partner Group works as the administrator for "Stop Loss" insurance between Voya Financial and Anthem Blue Cross. Over the last three years, the district has seen an increase to medical high claimants exceeding the \$500,000 threshold. "Stop Loss" insurance protects the districts' risk for self-funding medical claims to a certain threshold. Burnham Benefits, our health and welfare benefits consultant conducted a marketing analysis for the district of stop loss carriers and is recommending Voya Financial as the new carrier with a \$500,000 individual stop loss level. The administrative fee is \$42.90 per employee per month. The one-year period agreement is due to begin on January 1, 2018, and run through December 31, 2018.

There are no changes to the self-funded medical plans except for the addition of "Stop Loss" insurance.

It is recommended that the Board approve the agreement with ReliaStar Life Insurance Company dba Voya Financial and Stealth Partner Group for the period of January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2018.
