Approval is requested for three elementary schools, ten intermediate schools, and four high schools to conduct special summer programs for students preceding the start of the regular school session. The focus of these programs include: "Early Start" programs for transition into a new setting such as into kindergarten, seventh, or ninth grade; "Early Start" programs focused on early assessment of language arts and math; Bridge programs for students enrolled in College Success Path (CSP), Academy, or for the first time, in Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID); Bridge programs for Advanced Placement (AP) focused on support for English learners; and/or Bridge programs targeting academic motivation for at-risk students. Programs support student success in the coming academic year. All programs plan to include a parent education component. All costs, including teachers, classified assistance, transportation, and necessary supplies, will be paid with school site categorical funds.

Agenda Item 6 – A: Resolution No. 6 – Lease/Lease-Back – Three Schools

Education Code (EC) Section 17406 authorizes the governing board of a school district, without advertising for bids, to lease district owned property to any person, firm, or corporation for a minimum of \$1 per year as long as the instrument by which such property is let requires the other party to construct (or provide for the construction of) a building, buildings, or improvements upon the subject property, and the title to the subject property (including building or improvements) vests in the school district at the expiration of the lease. The district leases the property (or sections of the property) to a contractor/developer, who builds or improves the property and receives lease payments from the district until the school improvements are paid off (Lease/Lease-Back process or LLB).

A resolution is required by the governing board to authorize a series of interrelated agreements which will allow the execution and delivery of site leases, subleases, and construction services agreements and other acts related to the construction/improvements at Garden Park and Monroe elementary schools and Bell Intermediate School. The construction will include comprehensive modernization improvements which will take place during the 2012-13 year. Students from these schools will be temporarily housed at Patton and Northcutt elementary schools and Chapman Education Center respectively.

Plans and specifications have been approved by the California Division of State Architects for each project. The district requested proposals and qualifications from interested builders and contractors for the improvements, and recommends the accompanying list.

It is recommended that the Board adopt Resolution No. 6 which authorizes the execution and delivery of site leases, subleases and construction services agreements, and other acts related to the construction of the Garden Park Elementary School Project, Monroe Elementary School Project, and Bell Intermediate School Project.

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Agenda Item 6 – C: Extend Bid No. 9901 – Agreement for Transportation Services for Special Education Students

On June 1, 1999, Durham School Services LP, formerly Durham Transportation Inc., was awarded the bid to provide transportation services for special education students. On June 2, 2009, the agreement was extended an additional five years from July 1, 2009, through August 11, 2014. The bid instructions and conditions contain provisions for an annual price increase not to exceed the consumer price index (CPI).

The company has requested a price increase of 1.5% to the rates currently in effect from August 15, 2012, through August 14, 2013.

Effective October 12, 1994, the State of California approved the use of California Multiple Award Schedules (CMAS) by local governments (i.e. city, county, district, or other local governmental body empowered to expend public funds) for information technology products and services. Using a CMAS contractor would be a cost-effective manner of procurement for print shop and information systems equipment maintenance.

Public Contracts Code Section 10298, 10299, and 12100 provides that the governing board of any school district, without advertising for bids, may authorize any public agency to purchase equipment and services for its use in the manner in which the public agency is authorized by law to make such purchases. The State of California authorized school districts to purchase services from Xerox Corporation (CMAS Contract No. 3-01-36-0030A) on the California Multiple Award Schedules in accordance with the same specifications, terms, and conditions. The State of California CMAS contract with Xerox Corporation is valid through December 31, 2012.

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Agenda Item 7 – G: Consideration of Reduction in Board Members Stipend

Board members have expressed the desire to continue a reduction in the monthly stipend paid to individual members of the Board equal with the reduction of approximately 2.25 percent taken by all other employees in the district. Education Code 35120 sets the stipend of board members in districts less than 60,000 ADA but above 25,000 at \$750 per month. On an annual basis, the governing board may increase the compensation of individual board members in an amount not to exceed 5 percent. As a matter of record, it has been the practice of current and past Garden Grove Unified School District Board of Education members not to increase their stipend and therefore, it currently remains at \$750 per month originally set by the Education Code, less the reduction taken for the 2011-12 school year.
