#### 6. BUSINESS

Agenda Item 6 – A: Annual Budget Report 2012-13

Education Code Section 42127(a) requires each school district to adopt a budget and file with the county superintendent of schools on or before the first day of July of each year.

The 2011-12 base revenue limit of \$6,489.35 was deficited by 20.602%. This brought the revenue limit down to \$5,152.41. The base revenue limit of \$6,489.35 is increased by \$212 to represent the 3.24% COLA for 2012-13. The latest deficit proposed by the Governor is 22.272%. An additional 6.542% deficit has been applied to represent possible cuts if the temporary taxes are not passed by the voters in November 2012. These changes combine to reduce the 2012-13 revenue limit to \$4,770.42 per student.

The proposed budget has been available for public inspection from August 27 through September 4, 2012. The Annual Budget contains statements of revenue, expenditure, and changes in balances in the following funds:

General Fund (#01) Building Fund (#21)

Adult Education Fund (#11) Capital Facilities Fund (#25)
Child Development Fund (#12) School Facilities Fund (#35)

Cafeteria Account (#13) Special Reserve Fund-Capital Projects (#40)

Deferred Maintenance Fund (#14) Self Insurance Fund (#67)

In submitting the 2012-13 September Adopted Budget, the Board understands its fiduciary responsibility to maintain fiscal solvency for the current and subsequent two fiscal years. With the 2012-13 September Adopted Budget submission, the Board is providing an update on the budget reductions plan for fiscal year 2012-13. Due to California's sluggish economic recovery, the uncertain outcome of the Governor's November tax initiative, and proposed implementation of trigger reductions for 2012-13, it is recognized that, if necessary, the school district will continue to implement cuts of \$33.3 million in 2012-13, \$51.3 million in 2013-14, and an additional \$70.1 million in 2014-15 to maintain fiscal solvency.

It is recommended that the Board adopt the Annual Budget Report for 2012-13 (Board Report 9/4/12-3) and authorize its filing with the Orange County Superintendent of Schools.

Agenda Item 6 – D: Resolution No. 13 – Establishment of Gann Appropriations Limit

Article XIII B of the California Constitution places various limitations on the fiscal powers of the state and each local government.

Government Code Section 7910 requires that the governing body of each local jurisdiction annually adopt a resolution establishing its estimated appropriations limit for the current year and the actual appropriations limit for the preceding year.

The calculations of the actual 2011-12 and estimated 2012-13 appropriations limits have been made based on formulas provided by the Superintendent of Public Instruction. Documentation used in the determination of the appropriations limit is attached to the resolution and has been available to the public in the Office of Business Services, in accordance with Education Code Section 42132.

It is recommended that the Board adopt Resolution No. 13 which recalculates the district's 2011-12 appropriations limit and establishes the 2012-13 appropriations limit.

Agenda Item 6 – E: Application for Class Size Reduction Program and Certification 2012-13

Education Code (EC) Sections 52120-52128.5, 17200, and California Code of Regulation, Title 5, establish the Class Size Reduction (CSR) Program which provides incentive funding for school districts that reduce class size to 20 students in grades 1 and 2 and kindergarten or grade 3. The CSR Operations Application allows the district to apply for incentive funding for each new or continuing student participating in grades K, 1, 2, and 3 in the 2012-13 school year. The expected funding for 2012-13 is \$1,071 per student, for CSR classes with average daily enrollment that do not exceed 20.44. Education Code Section 52124.3 allows for flexibility in the CSR program and provides a new schedule of reduced funding percentages for classes exceeding 20.44 pupils for a four-year period, from 2008-09 through 2011-12. However, Section 31 of Senate Bill 70 amended this section of EC 52124.3 and extended flexibility for an additional two years through 2013-14. School districts may apply for no more than the number of classes identified in the 2008-09 Operations Application.

It is recommended that the Board approve submission of the Class Size Reduction Program Operations Funding Applications 2012-13.
