Agreement Between the Garden Grove Unified School District and the John W. Gardner Center for Youth and Their Communities, Stanford University: Release of Student Data for the Purpose of Data and Program Analysis

The John W. Gardener Center (JGC) has developed the Youth Data Archive (YDA), an archive of matched longitudinal administrative data for conducting policy and program analysis for educational leaders and practitioners. To ensure that the YDA is a valuable resource for all agencies contributing data, the project will work with the Garden Grove Unified School District to identify research questions that will be included in the project scope on behalf of the district.

The district may disclose some or all of the following data to the JGC: student identifiers and demographics, school enrollment and attendance, academic achievement, after school program participation, disciplinary data, and physical fitness test data.

Permission is requested to enter into an Agreement with the John W. Gardener Center, Stanford University which allows for the release of personally identifiable student data so the JGC may assist the district with data analysis for the purpose of program evaluation with a focus on college readiness. The Agreement will be in effect October 3, 2012, through October 3, 2015.

Agenda Item 5 – A: Resolution No. 15 – Approval of Contract for Cal-SAFE Program and Authorization of Signatures

The Cal-SAFE (California School Age Families Education) Program was established by Chapter 1078, Statutes of 1998. It is a comprehensive, integrated, community linked, school-based program for pregnant and parenting teens and their children. The program provides educational services to school age mothers as well as parenting training and related services with the goal of helping these students graduate from high school.

Agenda Item 5 – B: Understanding American Citizenship Program Grant

The Orange County Department of Education and University of California, Irvine History Project have been awarded a U.S. Department of Education Teaching American History grant to serve ACCESS and Orange County continuation school history teachers. Through professional development, this program will improve teachers' mastery of the content of traditional American History; provide academically-guided support for standards-aligned curriculum reform; support capacity-building and developing-teacher networks for long-term sustainability of the project in Orange County; and increase students' content knowledge and historical thinking.

The history teachers at Hare Continuation High School applied for and were awarded the *Understanding American Citizenship* (*UAC*) program grant for the 2012-13 school year. This grant will fund professional development sessions focused on U.S. History through the lens of citizenship designed by the history department at University of California, Irvine. The \$9,700 grant will cover the *UAC* Project Professional Development Institute, Seminar, Lesson Study, and Field Study dates.
