Agenda Item 4 – B: Waiver of California High School Exit Examination (CAHSEE) for Students with a Disability

At the request of a parent or guardian, a school principal shall submit a request to the Board of Education for a waiver of the requirement to pass the high school exit examination for a student with a disability who has taken the high school exit examination with modifications that alter what the test measures and has received the equivalent of a passing score on one or both subject matter parts of the examination.

The Board may waive the requirement to successfully pass one or both subject matter parts of the high school exit examination for a student with a disability if the principal certifies to the Board that the student has all of the following:

1. An individualized education program (IEP) or Section 504 plan in place that requires modifications to be provided to the pupil when taking the high school exit examination
2. Sufficient high school level course work, either satisfactorily completed or in progress, in a high school level curriculum sufficient to have attained the skills and knowledge otherwise needed to pass the high school exit examination
3. An individual score report for the student showing that the student has received the equivalent of a passing score on the high school exit examination while using a modification that fundamentally alters what the high school exit examination measures as determined by the State Board of Education.

A “modification” is defined as any variation in the assessment environment or process that fundamentally alters what the test measures or affects the comparability of scores.

Agenda Item 6 – A: Authorization to Renew Contract for Mandated Cost Claims Services

Education Code 42243.6 allows school districts to file reimbursement claims with the State Controller's Office (SCO) for costs incurred in meeting state mandates. School Innovations & Advocacy (SIA) has prepared and filed the district's mandated cost claims since October 1995, and continues to perform satisfactorily. The services include data collection, identification of reimbursable expenses, training of staff, and representation of claims with the SCO or the Commission of State Mandates during the audit process.

School Innovations & Advocacy will prepare and file state approved mandates, which include current year reimbursement claims, next year's estimated claims, and new claims for claimable programs authorized by the SCO. The State Controller's Office is offering to freeze the current annual contract price (\$47,750) for the next year, with the ability to opt-out with notice, at the end of the year of the agreement. The agreement period begins July 1, 2013, and expires on June 30, 2014.

The state has required school districts to provide mandated services, but has not provided funding to reimburse local costs since 2006-07. It is advisable to continue the filing of claims as the state is obligated to pay. Once the state allocates adequate funds, the professional service fees are fully claimable and reimbursable.

It is recommended that the Board authorize the renewal of the contract with School Innovations & Advocacy to provide services that include the preparation, filing, and monitoring of mandated cost claims for the agreement period July 1, 2013, through June 30, 2014.

On June 15, 2010, the Board accepted bids for maintenance of copier equipment. The specifications contained provisions, which allowed extension of the bid, one year at a time, for up to four years. The specifications also contain a price escalation clause for price adjustments. Business Machines Consultants, Inc. (BMC) is requesting an extension with no price increase for maintenance of exiting Panasonic copier equipment. Permission is requested to extend the contract for the 2013-14 fiscal year with BMC for maintenance of copier equipment.

Agenda Item 6 – D: Renew Agreement for Trash Collection Services

On April 21, 1987, the Board of Education adopted Resolution No. 29 authorizing the district to contract with Garden Grove Disposal for trash collection services without competitive bidding.

Garden Grove Disposal is able to service the entire school district and has provided trash collection services to the district for over 20 years. Service has been satisfactory, and the company has been very responsive to the district's needs.

The existing contract contains provisions that allow an increase or decrease in collection rates based on the Consumer Price Index for the metropolitan Los Angeles area. During the latter part of fiscal year 1996-97, Garden Grove disposal reduced the monthly cost of our trash collection rates for a 3-yard bin from \$194 per month to a revised amount of \$179 per month. The monthly cost has been maintained through fiscal years 1997-98 to 2012-13. Garden Grove Disposal has agreed to provide services for 2013-14 at the same rate.

It is recommended that the Board approve renewal of the agreement with Garden Grove Disposal for trash collection services for one year from July 1, 2013, through June 30, 2014, under the terms and conditions of the existing contract.

Agenda Item 6 – E: School Accountability Report Card Services Agreement

Education Code 35256 requires each school district to annually prepare and make available the School Accountability Report Card (SARC). The SARC includes reportable information items such as average salary information of teachers and administrators, expenditures per pupil, types of services offered at each school site, dropout rates, progress toward reducing class sizes, and teaching credential information. Other reportable items are required such as graduation rate, number of advanced placement courses offered by subject, the school's Academic Performance Index, and participation in special programs or grants.

The district has retained the services of School Innovations & Advocacy, Inc. to assist with data compilation, analysis, and development of the annual reports for the district and each school since the 2001-02 school year. School Innovations & Advocacy, Inc. is offering the current year annual fee (\$60,800) for three years for reports prepared for 2013-14, 2014-15, and 2015-16.

It is recommended that the Board authorize the contract with School Innovations & Advocacy, Inc. to provide school accountability report card data collection and report services in a three-year agreement from the 2013-14 through 2015-16 school year.

Agenda Item 7 – E: Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators

The Commission on Teacher Credentialing has adopted Title 5 procedures that govern district requests for issuing and renewing emergency credentials. Education Code Section 80026 now requires that the Board adopt a Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators no later than July 1 of each year. This declaration is valid for 12 months and is an estimate of the number of teachers with emergency credentials that may be needed during the 2013-14 school year. The estimate on the accompanying declaration is based on the number of emergency credentials requested by the district during the past several years. Many of the requests are for teachers being used as substitutes.

It is recommended that the Board adopt the Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators for the 2013-14 school year.
