Agenda Item 5 - B: Assembly, Field, and Resident Outdoor Science School Programs Sponsored by the Orange County Department of Education and Other District-Approved Organizations

The Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) and other district-approved organizations sponsor assembly and field programs and Outdoor Science School camp experiences for elementary school students on varying dates throughout the school year. The assembly programs offer age-appropriate assembly presentations. Participation fees will be paid by categorical funds, grants, and/or by parent groups. The field trip programs offered are one and two-day trips to local venues. Participation fees and transportation costs will be paid by categorical funds, grants, and/or parent groups. The Outdoor Science School programs offer three, four, or five-day camp experiences for sixth grade students. Camp fees and transportation costs will be paid by parent and/or parent group donations, sponsorships, and fund-raising.

Although there is no direct cost to the district general fund, the OCDE and other district-approved organizations require approval by the district Board of Education to enter into a contract. This carries with it the agreement to guarantee payment of the student fees. The administration and parents of the participating schools have designed plans to confirm prepayment which would relieve the district of that liability. Specific guidelines for the handling of fund-raising projects and the limitations of use of school time for this project have been agreed upon by parents and staff. Funds will be available for students with financial need.

Agenda Item 5 – C: Supplemental Educational Services for Title I Students

Supplemental Educational Services are additional academic instruction designed to increase the academic achievement of students in Program Improvement schools. Supplemental Educational Services are a component of Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act as reauthorized by No Child Left Behind Act, Section 1116(e). These services are provided to students from low-income families who are attending Title I schools that are in year two or more of Program Improvement. Supplemental Educational Services may include academic assistance such as tutoring, remediation, and other educational interventions that are consistent with the content and instruction used by the district and aligned with the state's academic content standards. Supplemental Educational Services must be provided outside of the regular school day by state-approved providers. The Garden Grove Unified School District has applied and been approved to also serve as a provider.

Authorization is requested to enter into a contractual agreement with the state approved providers certified by the California State Department of Education, for Supplemental Educational Services during the 2013-14 school year.

Agenda Item 6 – B: Agreement for Employee Benefits Consulting and Brokerage Services

The Garden Grove Unified School District provides self-insured health benefits to all eligible employees. The district has used the professional consulting services of Designed Protection Services for the past two and one-half years. The implementation of the Affordable Care Act has triggered a greater need for a broad range of in-depth consulting services. These additional services will allow for proper legal application of the laws and actuarial review of our entire benefits platform. Therefore, the district has made the decision to contract with Burnham Benefits, Irvine, California. The district has negotiated a one-year agreement with a flat fee of \$14,583.00 per month effective September 1, 2013, through August 31, 2014. Burnham Benefits brings many years of experience in assisting districts with innovative benefits solutions to control costs which will be critical in the challenging times ahead.

The proposed agreement with Burnham Benefits reflects the following fee schedule for Consulting Services, including legal and actuarial advisement, benefit plan design, funding analysis, and compliance review:

Monthly flat fee -- \$14,583.00

Agenda Item 6 – C: Agreement for Sale and Disposal of Obsolete and/or Surplus Equipment Services

The Board grants permission annually to conduct sales of obsolete/surplus equipment. The district currently contracts with InterScholastic Trading Company, LLC (InterSchola) and has conducted such sales in the past with limited success. The Liquidation Company (TLC) provides a service to assist districts in the disposal of obsolete/surplus equipment and personal property by facilitating these sales in a real-time auction environment or the internet. The Liquidation Company retains a portion of the final sale price as their commission or fee for service, 35% of gross sales for items sold, and remits the proceeds from sales, less tax, on a quarterly basis. Education Codes 17545 and 17546 permit the sale and disposal of obsolete/surplus equipment and personal property, and allows the use of a private auction firm. The Assistant Director of Business Services should be delegated the authority to transfer and release obsolete/surplus equipment and personal property. The use of TLC's services should result in efficient sales of surplus property and reduce the inventory and storage requirements of obsolete/surplus items waiting for disposal.

Agenda Item 6 – J: California Fruit and Vegetable Program Grant

In May 2008, the National School Lunch Act was amended to add the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) which allows competitive grant opportunities for public elementary schools to participate. The purpose of the grant is to provide all children in eligible schools with a variety of free fresh fruit and vegetable snacks throughout the day as a supplement and to teach students about good nutrition. The district's Food Services Department submitted an application for potentially eligible schools, and the California Department of Education Nutrition Services Department selected schools based on the percentages of low-income students eligible for free or reduced-price meals and their ability to properly implement and operate the FFVP. The grant allocation is \$50 per student through a reimbursement claim process. The district was notified that eight elementary schools are eligible in 2013-14: Bryant, Eisenhower, Hazard, Heritage, Russell, Simmons, Violette, and Woodbury. The grant award for eight schools is \$239,735. Fruits and vegetables will be served during the morning recess a minimum of two times weekly, and will be administered by the district's Food Services Department.
