Agenda Item 6 – A: Acceptance of First Interim Report

Education Code Sections 42130 and 42131 (a)(1) require that a report covering the financial and budgetary status of the district be submitted to the governing board for the period ending October 31. The report must be approved by the governing board no later than 45 days after the close of the period. The governing board must certify whether or not the school district is able to meet its financial obligations for the remainder of the fiscal year and two subsequent years.

The First Interim Report for Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balances is submitted for the period ending October 31, 2013. This report uses the 2013-14 Adopted Budget Report as the base and provides a comparison of the actual and projected revenues and expenditures.

Based on available financial information, the governor's proposed budget and current forecasts, the district will be able to meet its financial obligations for the balance of the fiscal year and two subsequent fiscal years, therefore, assigning a positive certification to its First Interim Budget. In submitting the 2013-14 First Interim Report, the Board understands its fiduciary responsibility to maintain fiscal solvency for the current and subsequent two fiscal years.

The Standards and Criteria Summary Review is presented with the First Interim Report.

It is recommended that the Board accept the First Interim Report and certify that the district will be able to meet its financial obligations for the 2013-14 fiscal year and for two subsequent fiscal years.

Agenda Item 6 – D: Resolution No. 18 – Establish Cafeteria Fund

Education Code Section 38090 states that a school district can establish a separate fund for the purpose of deposit and expenditure of revenues received for the purpose of Cafeteria Fund. The governing board has previously determined that there is a need to provide a separate fund for the operation of the Food Services Program and disbursements from this fund may be made for the payment of all activities related to and necessary for the operation of a Food Service Program. The Orange County Department of Education, in complying with the said code sections, has established Fund 1313 for this purpose and the Garden Grove Unified School District wishes to comply with the California Administrative and Education Code provisions and the Orange County Department of Education directives.

It is recommended that the Board adopt Resolution No. 18 to establish a Cafeteria Fund with the County Treasurer for the purpose of accumulating and expending revenues effective December 3, 2013.

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Agenda Item 6 – E: E-Rate Telecommunications and Internet Access Funding

The district is eligible for Federal Communications Commission (FCC) E-Rate Telecommunications discounts and funds to install or improve network/internet access or connections at eligible schools. The E-Rate program is administered by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) in granting E-Rate funding from the Schools and Libraries Programs of the Universal Service Fund. Recipients of E-Rate funds must provide a funding match and additional resources including end-user equipment necessary to utilize the connectivity. The district has continuously participated in the program since its inception in 1996. Permission is requested to continue to apply and accept funding for federal E-Rate funding year 2014 as it becomes available.
