Agenda Item 6 – A: Resolution No. 32 – Emergency Roof Repairs

Public Contract Code Section 20113 authorizes emergency contracts for services without advertising or inviting bids when the cost exceeds the bid limitations. A unanimous vote by the Board of Education is required, along with the approval of the county superintendent of schools which has been secured.

Due to severe roof damage caused by high winds on April 28 and 29, 2014, emergency measures were needed to repair hazardous conditions that needed immediate attention at Anthony, Heritage, Paine, Parkview, Russell, and Violette elementary schools and Mark Twain School.

Agenda Item 6 – B: Class-Size Penalty (Grades 1 through 3) – Waiver Request for 2013-14 School Year

Education Code Section 41382 allows the State Board of Education specific waiver authority. Through Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), class size reduction (now called Grade Span Adjustment) was resumed in California and the district reached agreement with the Garden Grove Education Association on maintaining a school wide average of 28 maximum in grades 1 through 3. In addition to LCFF, Education Code 41376(a)(c) and (d) provide maximum student enrollment in any given class.

This year, one third-grade classroom in the district had 33 students enrolled; one student over the state Education Code of 32 for that grade level. Due to the time of year in which the student enrolled and the class configurations at the site, it was determined that reconfiguring classrooms was not feasible and a wavier would be necessary. Therefore, it is recommended that the district file a specific waiver application for class-size penalty (grades 1 through 3) for the 2013-14 school year.

Agenda Item 6 – C: Final Settlement Agreement and Mutual General Release

On or about November 21, 2013, LHA Group, Inc. (LHA), a sub-consultant of Y'Deen Associates/Architects (Y'Deen), filed a complaint in United States District Court for breach of contract, copyright infringement, inverse condemnation, reverse palming off, unfair competition, and fraud against Y'Deen, the district, and the replacement architects and contractors. On May 5, 2014, LHA, Y'Deen, and the district participated in mediation. Without admitting any liability and solely to avoid the expense and inconvenience of litigation, LHA, Y'Deen, and the district sought to settle disputes and claims arising from the alleged disputes and disagreement regarding the district's school modernization program which included 65 schools.

With the agreed upon settlement, LHA releases all claims whether based in federal or state law, any and all claims included in the state action and the federal action, including claims for copyright infringement, breach of contract, or interference with contract, and any other costs, expenses, damages or claims arising from the district's school modernization program. LHA also agrees to dismiss, with prejudice, the appeal currently pending before the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals and agrees to refrain from bringing any further action against any of the defendants in state court.

Effective October 12, 1994, the State of California approved the use of California Multiple Award Schedules (CMAS) by local governments (i.e., city, county, district, or other local governmental body empowered to expend public funds) for information technology products and services. Using a CMAS contractor would be a cost-effective manner of procurement for information technology services in the installation of the Wide Area Network (WAN) project.

Public Contracts Code Section 10298, 10299, 12100 et al., provides that the governing board of any school district, without advertising for bids, may authorize any public agency to purchase equipment and services for its use in the manner in which the public agency is authorized by law to make such purchases. The State of California authorized school districts to purchase services from Epoch Universal, Inc. (CMAS Contract No. 3-14-70-2715C) on the California Multiple Award Schedules in accordance with the same specifications, terms, and conditions. The State of California CMAS contract with Epoch Universal, Inc. is valid April 2, 2014, through October 31, 2018.

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Agenda Item 7 – D: Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators

The Commission on Teacher Credentialing has adopted Title 5 procedures that govern district requests for issuing and renewing emergency credentials. Education Code Section 80026 now requires that the Board adopt a Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators no later than July 1 of each year. This declaration is valid for 12 months and is an estimate of the number of teachers with emergency credentials that may be needed during the 2014-15 school year. The estimate on the accompanying declaration is based on the number of emergency credentials requested by the district during the past several years. Many of the requests are for teachers being used as substitutes.

It is recommended that the Board adopt the Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators for the 2014-15 school year.
