Agenda Item 5 - A: Education for Homeless Children and Youth Grant Program

The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 reauthorized the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act's Education for Homeless Children and Youth Grant program. The McKinney-Vento Act's grant program provides provisions designed to improve educational stability, access, and support for the academic achievement of children who are homeless. The local education agencies may use these funds for supplemental activities to carry out the purpose of the law. These activities may include: referrals for homeless children and youth for health services, mental health services, transportation, school supplies, and other assistance needed to enable homeless children and youth to attend school.

The Education for Homeless Children and Youth Grant program is a competitive grant, first awarded to the district in 2009 through 2011, that will provide three years of funding between 2015 to 2018 to support district homeless children. The district may receive up to \$125,000 per year to support the program during the three-year period.
