Agenda Item 4 - A: Resolution No. 13 – Conflict of Interest Code

Under the Political Reform Act, the Orange County Board of Supervisors is the reviewing body for the Conflict of Interest Code of the Garden Grove Unified School District. During even numbered years, code reviewing bodies are required by the Government Code Section 87306.5 to direct local agencies to review their conflict of interest codes to determine whether any amendments are required.

The Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) adopted Regulation No. 18730, which contains provisions of a "Model" conflict of interest code. In September 2000, the district approved by resolution the incorporation of the California FPPC Regulation No. 18730 as the body of the district's conflict of interest code along with district Appendices A and B. Review of the appendices indicates necessary changes to Appendix A, Designated Positions. Resolution No. 13 addresses changes in Appendix A and authorizes the Superintendent to forward a copy of this resolution to the Clerk of the Orange County Board of Supervisors for review and approval by the Orange County Board of Supervisors as required by Government Code Section 87303.

Agenda Item 5 – A: Resolution No. 12 - State Preschool Program Application for Continued Funding and Authorization of Signatures for 2015-16

State preschool classes are available for children living within district boundaries who have an eligible birth date and whose family gross income does not exceed the income ceilings established by the California Department of Education. The curriculum and strategies utilized in the preschool classroom are aligned with the California Preschool Learning Foundations. Parent involvement and education is a key component of the preschool program, including classes that teach parents how to develop early literacy at home. The district is eligible for approximately \$3,674,530 to support existing or new preschool programs in 24 classrooms at the following 12 schools: Brookhurst, Bryant, Clinton Corner, Eisenhower, Heritage, Lawrence, Murdy, Peters K-3, Rosita, Russell, Violette and Wakeham.
