Education Code Section 15282 has since been amended to change the maximum number of consecutive terms members of the Committee may serve from two to three. The Board of Education is required to approve amendments to the Bylaws of the Committee.

Agenda Item 6 – L: Extend Authorization to Participate in the California Multiple Award Schedules – Purchase of Information Technology Products and Services (Contract No. 3-10-70-2473L)

Effective October 12, 1994, the State of California approved the use of California Multiple Award Schedules (CMAS) by local governments (i.e. city, county, district, or other local governmental body empowered to expend public funds) for information technology products and services. Using a CMAS contract would be a cost-effective manner of procurement for information technology services in the installation of the Wide Area Network project.

Public Contracts Code Sections 10298, 10299, and 12100 provide that the governing board of any school district, without advertising for bids, may authorize any public agency to purchase equipment and services for its use in the manner in which the public agency is authorized by law to make such purchases. The State of California has authorized school districts to purchase services from NIC Partners on the California Multiple Award Schedules in accordance with the same specifications, terms, and conditions. The State of California CMAS Contract No. 3-10-70-2473L with NIC Partners has been extended and is valid from December 23, 2014, through November 30, 2019.

Agenda Item 6 – M: Renewal of Wide Area Network License Agreement

The Board granted permission on February 20, 2007, to participate in the federal E-rate program to install or improve network/internet access connectivity to eligible schools. The district entered into a five-year licensing agreement with renewal options to use a multimedia fiber wide area network (WAN) offered by Sunesys, a provider of data/media lines approved by the federal E-rate administrator, Schools and Libraries Division. Sunesys is a telecommunications service provider owned and operated by InfraSource Services, a leading provider of infrastructure services for electric, gas, and telecommunications subject to FCC regulations.

Sunesys built the managed gigabit fiber optic network that gave the district access to broadband and expandability into other options to deliver educational programs more effectively. The agreement allowed the district to upgrade the district's entire WAN to a Metropolitan Area Network (MAN) connecting the district office to each of its schools, and also included an addendum for a fiber connection from the district to Orange County Department of Education. The initial term was five years with renewal options up to twenty years, and may be adjusted for the consumer price index. The district's monthly costs for the network services are one-third the amount bid by the former provider (AT&T) after the federal E-rate and California teleconnect fund (CTF) discounts have been applied. The agreement is contingent upon E-rate approval, and also subject to California Public Utility Commission review and approval.

On February 9, 2010, the district signed an agreement with Sunesys for a 10 gigabit connection to the Level 3 data center in Tustin. After work was completed, services started on January 1, 2011. The term of this agreement is sixty (60) months from the acceptance date. The agreement states that it will automatically renew for additional terms of sixty (60) months as noted below.

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Agenda Item 6 – N: Citizen's Bond Oversight Committee – Member Appointments

The mandatory functions of the Bond Oversight Committee (BOC) set forth in Education Code are to: 1) actively review and report on the proper expenditures of taxpayers' money for school construction; 2) advise the public as to whether the district is in compliance with Section 1(b)(3) of Article XIII of the California Constitution; and 3) provide oversight to ensure that bond revenues are expended for the purposes described, and that no funds are used for any teacher or administrative salaries or other school operating expenses.

Bond Oversight Committee members serve staggered two-year terms with some terms expiring May 9, 2015. The invitation to apply for the BOC and application form to identify qualified replacement members have been available since February 27, 2015, and have been announced in several local media, including the district's website. The deadline for the receipt of applications was March 20, 2015. Four members reapplied and one new individual applied. It is recommended that all five applicants be approved for appointment to the BOC to serve a two-year term, May 2015 through May 2017.
