Agenda Item 5 – A: Institute of Education Science Grant: Digital Scaffolding for English Language Arts, and Partnership with University of California, Irvine

The School of Education at the University of California, Irvine (UCI), in partnership with the Garden Grove Unified School District, has been awarded a \$3.5 million grant from the U.S. Department of Education's Institute of Education Sciences for a research project entitled Digital Scaffolding for English Language Arts. The UCI four-year project will take place from July 1, 2015, to September 30, 2019. The district will be receiving funds under a sub-contract in the amount of \$1,689,230 for project implementation.

The project will assess improvements in student achievement in reading, writing, and English language arts. During the 2015-16 school year, the grant will fund the purchase of class sets of Chromebook computers and iPads for participating seventh and eighth grade core English Language Arts classrooms, which will remain with the district after project implementation. All participating teachers will also receive professional development on how best to teach close reading of texts to intermediate students, with, and without digital scaffolding.

Agenda Item 6 – A: Resolution No. 26 - Authorization to Apply for and Secure Grant Funding from the South Coast Air Quality Management District #PA2015-06 AB 923 School Bus Replacement Program

The district requests authorization to apply for the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) School Bus Replacement Grant to replace twenty-two (22) pre-1994 diesel school buses with new CNG (Compressed Natural Gas) buses (twenty (20) 78-passenger buses, and two (2) 50-passenger buses) and infrastructure to support the additional equipment. The Air Quality Management District Board has recognized that funds are available and will take final action in October 2015 to release the award. The district qualifies for \$3,663,000 from the Carl Moyer Program AB 923 Fund and SCAQMD Lower Emissions School Bus Replacement Program. The grant provides \$166,500 per bus base price, \$4,500 for optional fire suppression system per bus, and \$14,000 per bus for CNG fueling station infrastructure. The district is required to provide matching funds in the amount of \$15,000 for each 78-passenger bus, and \$30,000 for each 50-passenger bus. As with past grants, the district agrees to operate the bus for a period of five years, provide for the fueling infrastructure, and crush one district-owned pre-1994 diesel school bus in exchange for each new CNG bus.

It is recommended that the Board authorize the district to apply for the South Coast Air Quality Management District School Bus Replacement Grant in the amount of \$3,663,000.
