Agenda Item 4 - A: License to Use Agreement Between Orange County Headstart, Inc. and Garden Grove Unified School District

Carver Elementary School will become Carver Early Childhood Education Center (ECEC) housing special education preschool, Headstart, and state preschool programs. The Headstart and state preschool programs will help create a campus of typical peers to meet the requirements for Local Education Agency. Carver ECEC campus will house thirteen (13) special education classrooms, one state preschool (typical peers), and one Headstart (typical peers) classroom. All classes will be offered in the morning and afternoon. This will create a campus environment allowing special education preschool age children access to typical peers for socialization and modeling.

A License to Use Agreement between Orange County Headstart, Inc. (OCHS) and the Garden Grove Unified School District has been established for one calendar year to provide services to preschool age low-income and special education students of the district. The OCHS shall operate an Early Childhood Education Center Program on the property located at Carver ECEC and will have use of one classroom on the property. This will create a classroom environment allowing preschool age children an opportunity to attend programs with typical peers.

Having Headstart on the campus brings another opportunity for district parents having limited income access to early childhood education.

It is recommended that the Board approve the License to Use Agreement between Orange County Headstart, Inc. and the Garden Grove Unified School District to provide services to preschool age low-income and special education students of the district. The term of the Agreement is for the period beginning August 19, 2015, through June 30, 2016.

Agenda Item 5 – A: College Board's Early Participation Program PSAT/NMSQT

The College Board Early Participation Program is an initiative to support the involvement of all students in the process of preparing for college at an earlier age. Students' earlier involvement in the PSAT/NMSQT program will also expose them to a wealth of college planning and preparation tools.

The College Board supports this initiative by providing districts with access to additional savings when districts pay to engage at least one grade of pre-junior students in taking the PSAT/NMSQT. The district has been participating in the program since 2007. The College Board Early Participation Program will serve up to 3,588 10th grade students and 3,788 11th grade students at a rate of \$11.25 per student. This rate is reduced by 14 percent for all students enrolled in 10th and 11th grade. If approved, the district would offer this Early Participation Program to 10th and 11th grade students in the 2015-16 school year.

It is recommended that the Board grant permission to offer the College Board's Early Participation Program PSAT/NMSQT to district 10th and 11th grade students for the 2015-16 school year, at a cost of \$82,980.

Agenda Item 5 – B: AVID Implementation Agreement for 2015-16

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) is a secondary college readiness system that targets students who may be the first in their families to attend college of whom many are from low-income or minority families. The AVID program places students in rigorous courses and puts them on the college track.

The Garden Grove Unified School District has worked collaboratively with the AVID Center since 2003. The AVID Center would like to continue to provide support to the district which includes access to training for the AVID site team(s) and AVID elective teacher(s) through AVID Summer Institute; AVID District Leadership training and access to other quality continuing professional development trainings or services such as AVID Path Trainings; AVID Weekly; AVID Test Prep; and others. They will aide in the analysis of data for our AVID school sites and review the quality of the implementation through the certification process. The cost of this support for our seventeen secondary sites is \$56,015.
