Agenda Item 5 – A: Titan Choices and Titan Asian-American Pacific Islanders Ambassador Program Partnership with California State University, Fullerton

The Garden Grove Unified School District requests permission to enter into a collaborative partnership with California State University, Fullerton to implement the Titan Choices Program at Los Amigos High School and the Titan Asian-American Pacific Islanders (AAPI) Ambassadors Program at La Quinta High School. Both programs have a mission to help create and promote a college-going culture by providing support, mentoring, and appropriate resources for students at participating school sites. Los Amigos and La Quinta will be provided, on a part-time basis, a trained college student intern to supplement the work of the school guidance team. These interns will inform students of admission requirements and the pre-admission process though one-on-one college advisement, classroom presentations, lunch time or after-school workshops, and other outreach activities.

It is recommended that the Board grant permission to enter a collaborative partnership with California State University, Fullerton to implement the Titan Choices Program at Los Amigos High School and the Titan AAPI Ambassadors Program at La Quinta High School.

Agenda Item 5 – B: Representative to the Rancho Santiago, Coast College, and North Orange County Adult Education Consortia

In 2013-14, the state budget included a two-year, \$25 million, state-wide adult education planning grant. Assembly Bill (AB) 86 called for the development of local regional consortia comprised of representatives from community college districts, K-12 districts, and other organizations that serve a role in adult education (each consortium was defined by the boundaries of a community college district).

To transition from planning to implementation, the 2015-16 State Budget includes a \$500 million Adult Education Block Grant (AEBG) to be allocated among the regional consortia. Assembly Bill 104 authorizes a community college district to join the local adult education consortium as a member and states that the member of the consortium shall be represented by an official designee.

The Garden Grove Unified School District is a member of three consortiums: Rancho Santiago Adult Education, Coast College Adult Education, and North Orange County Adult Education. An official representative is necessary to ensure that the district Adult Education program has a full voice in the decision-making process including the disbursement of consortia funds to provide adult education courses and student support services authorized by AB 104, Section 84913.

It is recommended that the Board approve Connie Van Luit, Director of Adult and Alternative Education, to serve as the official representative member for the Garden Grove Unified School District on the Rancho Santiago, Coast College, and North Orange County Adult Education Consortia for the 2015-16 fiscal year.

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Agenda Item 6 – A: Annual Disclosure of Workers' Compensation Liability

The Garden Grove Unified School District has been self-insured for Workers' Compensation since January 1979 and self-administered since October 1993.

Section 3702.6 of the Labor Code requires each public self-insurer of Workers' Compensation to advise its governing board, within 90 days of submission of the self-insurer's annual report, of the total liability shown on that report. The self-insurer's annual report covers the 2014-15 year and reports total liabilities of \$8,515,325. Current funding of these liabilities is in compliance with the requirements of the Government Accounting Standards Board Publication 10.

It is recommended that the Board accept the report of Workers' Compensation liabilities totaling \$8,515,325 for fiscal year 2014-15.

Agenda Item 6 – B: Lease/Leaseback – Alamitos Intermediate School Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning

Education Code (EC) section 17406 states that a school district "without advertising for bids, may let ... real property that belongs to the district if the [lease] requires the lessee ... to construct ... a building or buildings for the use of the school district" ("Lease/Leaseback"). Governing board action is required for the district to award a Lease/Leaseback contract. The Lease/Leaseback contract consists of the site lease and the facilities lease and all attachments thereto (the "Lease/Leaseback Contract Documents").

The plans and specifications for Alamitos Intermediate School Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) (DSA #04-114039) were approved by the California Division of the State Architect on June 25, 2015. Staff is recommending that the Board award a contract to GB Construction Inc. as they are the contractor for the modernization project.
