Agenda Item 4 - A: Memorandum of Understanding - Kids Vision for Life Orange County, Essilor Vision Foundation

Funding from Kids Vision for Life-Orange County, Essilor Vision Foundation in the amount of \$500,000 over 24 months would provide services to improve the vision of low-income children through screening, examination, and dispensing of corrective eyeglasses and to identify potential eye disease. Kids Vision for Life would collaborate with other local organizations to directly serve over 25,000 students ages 5-18 within Orange County with vision care, and also provide awareness and outreach services to school districts, nurses, teachers, and parents on the importance of good eye health.

Elementary and intermediate school students in the Garden Grove Unified School District will be screened over the next two years, beginning January 1, 2016, and ending January 1, 2018. Students who fail the vision screening will receive a comprehensive vision examination by an optometrist at the school site. Those students who need glasses will be able to pick out the frames and opticians will return to fit the finished glasses. All students are eligible to participate with parent consent and will receive glasses even if they already have vision insurance or Medi-Cal. Also included in the funding is an educational component which will encourage students to continue with optimal vision care.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Memorandum of Understanding between Kids Vision for Life-Orange County, Essilor Vision Foundation and the Garden Grove Unified School District to provide vision screenings to district students, kindergarten through eighth grade, beginning January 1, 2016, through January 1, 2018.

Pursuant to the Charter Schools Act of 1992 (Education Code Section 47600 et seq.) a charter school petition proposing to operate a single charter school that will operate within the geographic boundaries of the Garden Grove Unified School District may be submitted to the district's governing board after meeting specified signature requirements. The Board is required to hold a public hearing and either grant or deny the charter petition within specified timelines after receipt by the Board of the charter petition.

To commence the statutory timelines and facilitate the scheduling of the required public hearing and action on the petition, the Petition is submitted for receipt by the Board at this regular public meeting.

Recorded action taken at a Board meeting establishes the date of receipt of the Petition by the Board of Education and commences statutory timelines for consideration and action on the proposed Petition.
