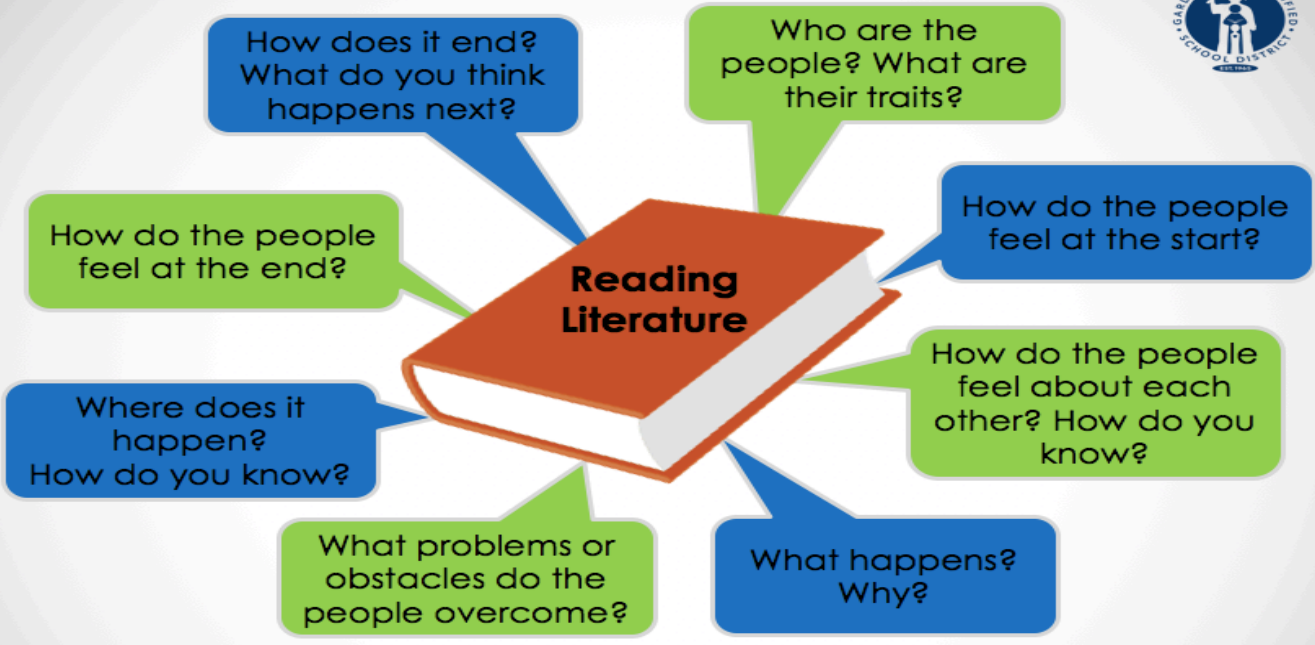


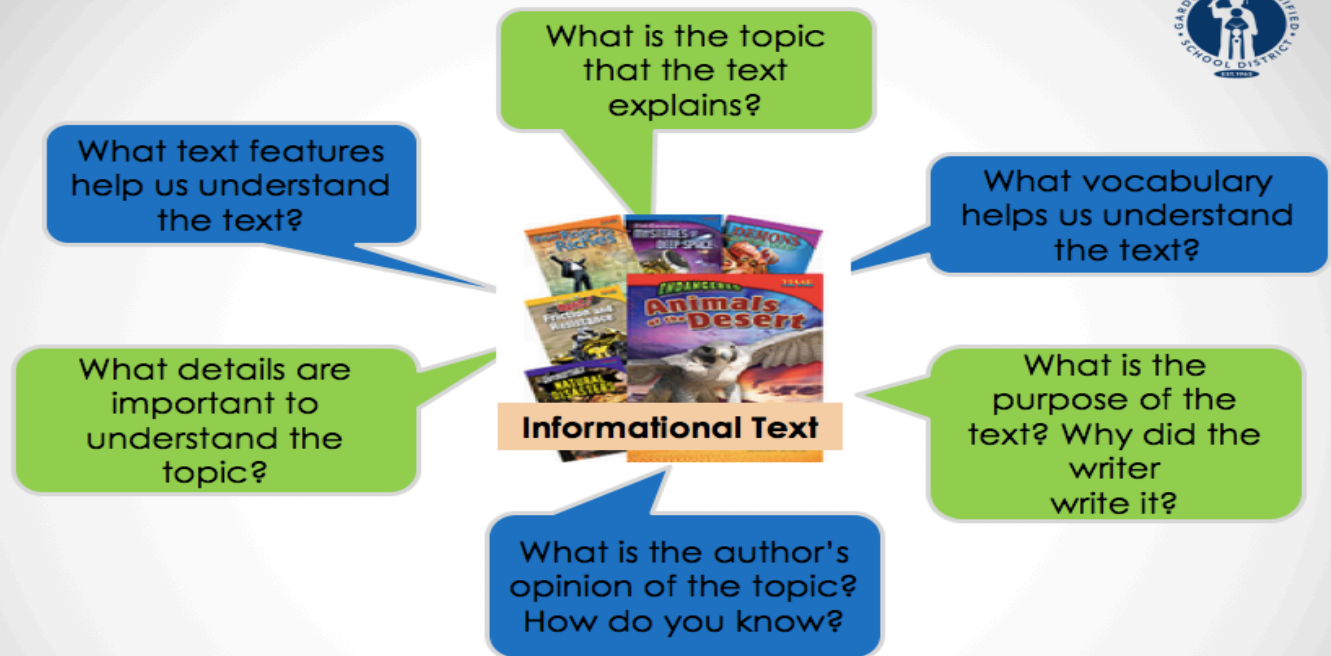

Reading Literature	Informational Text
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can you find an illustration or part that shows the main character/ setting/ problem in the story? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can you tell how the author uses this chart to help you understand?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What is the same about the characters in the two stories? What is different? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What does this chart add to your thinking about what you read?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What happened to the characters that is the same? What is different? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can you find the reason why the author thinks that...? Can you find the reason why the author believes...?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Did the characters solve the problem in different ways? If so, how? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Look at these two texts about the same topic. How are they the same? How are they different?

Reading Literature	Informational Text
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What is the same about how the story is presented visually (illustrations) and in writing? What is different? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What do you do when you come to words you do not know? (glossary, use context)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What happened to the characters that is the same? What happened that is different? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What features in the text help you find important information about what you are reading?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> How did characters solve problems in different ways across texts? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What does the author want the reader to understand about this text?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> How are the plots the same or different across texts? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Is the information provided by the authors the same or different?

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
