CONTINUED AREAS TO IMPROVE (As reported in our annual survey)

- 15% of students report they do not ask questions when they do not understand (compared to 31% from last year).
- 16% of students report they do not know how to study for tests (compared to 28% from last year).
  - Parents reported they would like more ideas on how to help their students at home and more opportunities for intervention and tutoring.

In 2016-2017, GGUSD is expanding after-school intervention programs and tutoring to help support student growth. We will continue to work to support parents and students in the development of scholarly habits.

## **CONTINUED AREAS TO IMPROVE**

According to our annual survey, overall the number of students who are concerned about the growth mindset, bullying, and facilities has decreased since 2015. However, we remain focused on these areas for improvement.



17% of students don't understand growth mindset (compared to 24% from last year).

GGUSD is implementing innovative instructional strategies and mentorship programs to improve student motivation and growth mindset.



20% of students agree that bullying is a problem (compared to 37% from last year).

GGUSD is launching WeTip, the nation's trusted anonymous tip hotline, to help combat bullying and cyberbullying.



25% of students express a concern about facilities (compared to 43% from last year).

GGUSD schools continue to receive modernization improvements and air conditioning and a new bond measure for continued improvements is on the horizon.

In 2016, GGUSD's average AP score was higher than the state, country, and world!



GGUSD's average pass rate of 62.6% is also higher than the state, country, and world. Scoring based on a scale of 1-5, a passing score being 3 or higher.

#### **CAREER-READINESS**



More than 6,000 high school students participate in 43 career pathways in 10 industry sectors in areas like biomedical, engineering, media, software development, and transportation. All pathways include UC/CSU approved course work, articulated college credit courses, and industry-recognized certifications. Intermediate schools offer CTE STEAM-lab courses to help equip students with 21st century skills.

GGUSD continues to add new opportunities for work based learning and internships.
